The Brown County United Way will grant \$50,000 to school attendance programs

Green Bay - The Brown County United Way Youth Development Impact Council will grant \$50,000 to programs that will improve student attendance in Brown County middle and high schools. In partnership with Brown County schools and the Partners in Education Attendance Task Force, the Brown County United Way is seeking proposals from private, non-profit, community and school organizations for the funds.

All proposals must include:

- An expected or demonstrated impact on school attendance.
- Easy access for youth in the geographical area of the program.
- A clear mission with objectives and measurable outcomes.

Preferred applicants will involve youth in decision making processes, include a youth mentoring program and provide a clear plan for measuring program effectiveness.

All qualified applicants must:

- Be located in Brown County and serve Brown County residents.
- Have the capacity to conduct the program and submit semi-annual, fiscal and outcome-data reports to the Brown County United Way.
- Measure program effectiveness and document its impact on participants.

All applications are due no later than 4 p.m. Wednesday, May 17. Finalists will be notified via telephone or email by Thursday, May 25.
