Almost \$5,000 in computer equipment to be given away

Brown County United Way and IBM will consider applications until August 1.

Green Bay - The Brown County United Way is seeking applications from local human services agencies to receive a grant of computer equipment worth almost \$5,000.

IBM Corporation will donate the equipment, along with \$2,900 to the Brown County United Way, as part of the corporation's nationwide charitable giving program.

Donated items include:

- One Young Explorer PC System, including a 17-inch color monitor, keyboard, power strip, speakers and desk.
- Two IBM ThinkCentre desktop computers with 17-inch color monitors.

Eligible agencies must be a registered 501(c)(3) located in Brown County that administers programs for early learning, youth education and development, literacy, job training, community and family services and/or support for seniors or the disabled.

Final selection of the recipient or recipients will be determined by a panel of IBM and Brown County United Way staff.

This donation will enable the recipient agency or agencies to provide computer access and skills training for youth, the unemployed and the disadvantaged.

All applications must be submitted no later than 12 p.m. Wednesday, August 1 to the Brown County United Way.
