### FOOD SCULPTURE CHALLENGE

- Build any kind of structure—from the simple to the ornate.
- The registration fee of \$550 provides you with over 1,100 cans of vegetables (see below for can images and sizes). You may purchase additional items on your own to complete your sculpture. You do not need to use all the cans included in your registration fee.
- The canned items included in your registration will be delivered to your 10'x10' space at the stadium on Aug. 2
- Teams may use props, including signage, and supporting materials when building, but structures must be comprised of at least 50% food and/or basic needs items. A platform is suggested.
- The sculpture must fit within a 10'x10' space.
- The food/basic needs items cannot be painted, taped or altered in a way that makes them unsuitable for donation.
- You must set up your sculpture between 1-4 p.m. on Monday, Aug. 2. It's not necessary for your team to attend the game.
- As you are planning and constructing, please track the following:
  - Number of items (i.e. 500 cans of veggies, 16 jars of peanut butter)
  - Dollars invested
  - Number of people participating
- Fan voting will take place during the game. The winning sculpture will be announced before the end of the game.
- All items will be donated to local food pantries at the discretion of Brown County United Way.
- If the game is cancelled due to inclement weather, the make-up date will be Wednesday, Aug. 4. There will be NO REFUNDS on the registration fee and all food will still be donated to area food pantries.
