# Brown County United Way Launches Mobile Classroom to Expand **Groundbreaking HubCAP Services**

June 10 Press Conference Will Feature Vehicle Tours, Stakeholder Interviews, and First Look at Mobile Education Unit

GREEN BAY, WI - Something big is rolling into Brown County - again. Brown County United Way, in partnership with more than 20 nonprofit agencies, is proud to announce the expansion of its HubCAP (Community Access Partnership) initiative with the launch of a new mobile classroom.

This milestone will be unveiled at a press conference on Tuesday, June 10 at 11:00 a.m. at Northeast Wisconsin Technical College (NWTC). The event will feature tours of HubCAP's three mobile units, including a first look at the mobile classroom, and opportunities to speak with key stakeholders from Brown County United Way and partner organizations.

- Job and financial assistance
- Education and skills training
